James, (40-60s) Butler to Miss Sophie. Role includes sections of silent physical comedy and small moments of improvisation along with traditional dialogue.
Miss Sophie, (60s-80s) A wealthy woman. Role includes sections of silent physical comedy and small moments of improvisation along with traditional dialogue.

Suzie, (24-40) Happy-go-lucky, a little giddy, a little silly, and a little pregnant; mezzo/alto with big belt; range: C#3–E5.

Cindy Lou, (24-40) The "bad girl" of the group, now reformed (to a point); has an incredible soft side and inner depth, mezzo soprano with belt; range: A3–E5.

Missy, (24-40) The overachiever of the group; an elementary school teacher with cat-eye glasses; soprano with belt; range: F#3–A5.

Betty Jean, (24-40) The self-anointed clown of the group; strong alto with big belt; range: D3–Eb5.

The Play That Goes Wrong

By Henry Lewis, Henry Shields & Jonathan Sayer Directed by Tyler Rosati 1st Rehearsal: March 4, 2025 Performances: March 28 – April 19, 2025

PLEASE NOTE: This is a physically demanding show. Most roles will require varying amounts of crawling, climbing, lifting, running, and/or falling. There is also a sword fight and some hand-to-hand combat.

Age ranges for characters are flexible (18+) and will depend upon groupings and pairings found through auditions.

Chris, (The director of the show – also plays Inspector Carter). A first-time director but a fairly decent actor. He tries his best to keep the show on track while gritting his teeth at the ineptness which surrounds him. Note: The actor cast in this role will need to be comfortable performing on a seven-foot-high platform with no railing.

Jonathan, (Plays Charles Haversham, deceased). He's been cast as a corpse but has trouble

playing dead. Note: The actor cast in this role will need to be comfortable performing on a seven-foot-high platform with no railing.

SANDRA: (Plays Florence, the fiancé of the deceased who is having a secret affair with his brother). She is the company's leading lady; a bit of a diva. Note: The actor cast in this role will need to be comfortable being in an enclosed box for up to 5 minutes.

MAX: (Plays Cecil, brother of the deceased who is having a secret affair with Florence – also plays Arthur the gardener in Act II). This role is fairly open to interpretation. Is he the company's typical male ingenue? Their go-to character actor? A bit of a ham who likes applause?

ROBERT: (Plays Thomas, the deceased best friend and Florence's brother). Earnest and optimistic, he always believes the show is going much more smoothly than it really is. Note: The actor cast in this role will need to be comfortable performing on a seven-foot-high platform with no railing.

DENNIS [or DENISE]: (Plays Perkins the butler). Probably the worst actor of the bunch. Note: The actor cast in this role will need to be comfortable performing on a seven-foot-high platform with no railing.

ANNIE: (The stage manager). Generally able to solve problems quickly. When she has to substitute as the leading lady, she goes from nervous to confident to downright competitive. **TREVOR**: (The sound tech guy). Occasionally misses his cues or forgets to turn his mic off. Generally stays backstage until he too must substitute as the leading lady. Note: The actor cast in this role will need to be comfortable being in an enclosed box for up to 5 minutes.

We will be casting 8 actors of all genders, various ages, races, to play multiple roles in this high energy comic romp about the American Revolution. Characters include Ethan Allen, Benedict Arnold, George Washington, John Adams, various soldiers, townspeople, etc.

Little Shop of Horrors

Book and Lyrics by Howard Ashman Music by Alen Menken Directed by Ilana Ransom 1st Rehearsal: May 13, 2025 Performances: June 6 – 29, 2025

Seymour Krelborn, (25-35) An insecure, put-upon florist's clerk and eventual hero. He is a genuine, well-meaning man who is taken for granted because of his clumsy ways and poor social skills. Vocal range: A2 to G4

Audrey, (25-35) Bleached-blond, Billie-Dawn-like, secret love of Seymour's life. She has poor self-worth and education, but incredibly good looks and a sweet and vulnerable demeanor. Vocal range: G#3 to D5

Mr. Mushnik, (55-65) The seasoned owner of the failing East Side flower shop and Seymour's nosy boss. He is profit-driven, greedy, and manipulative. Vocal range: G2 to F4

Orin Scrivello, (30-40) An egotistical dentist with a passion for leather and sadistic tendencies. Audrey's abusive boyfriend, who is targeted by Seymour. Also plays several other smaller roles. Vocal range: G4 to G2

The Plant (Audrey II), Puppet. An anthropomorphic cross between a Venus flytrap and an avocado, the plant has an appetite for human flesh that is appeased by Seymour. Puppeteer doubles as other sizes of the plant.

Voice Of The Plant, An actor/vocalist located offstage. The voice is that of a conniving, streetsmart 'villain.' A funky Rhythm and Blues voice is best. Vocal range top: G2 to G4

Crystal, Ronnette and Chiffon (20-35) are Black street urchins, acting as the occasional Greek Chorus. Young, hip, and smart, these girls are the only ones who have a grip on reality. Vocal range top: Ab3 to F5
